

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STUDYING BIBLICAL ART

You can use the art study response sheets with any artwork, however they were created to use alongside <u>Scenes</u> <u>from the Old & New Testament – Biblical Art Appreciation.</u>



This biblical art appreciation set combines stories from the Bible with beautiful works of art. Each story includes the text of the story retold for students, a full page highlighting a piece of classic art related to the story, and two art cards.

How to Study Art

Providing an enriching education is a goal for many homeschooling families. While many homeschoolers consider themselves non-artistic, implementing art study will help you achieve the goal of providing a well-rounded and enriching education. Studying art opens a child's mind and evokes inspiration for creativity. Making space in your homeschool for art allows your child to explore new ideas, learn self-expression, and communication skills. Art study is credited with not just a finite benefit of knowing famous artists, but with academic success and performance overall. Best of all, you can create this environment easily and in no time at all!

You can simply begin with showing your child a work of art. Then ask a mix of factual questions and thought provoking questions that allow for the child to express her thoughts without being wrong.

Examples of factual questions:


- What is the title of the artwork?
- When was the piece created?
- Who is the artist?
- What events happened that are represented in this artwork?

Examples of thought provoking questions that will elicit a personal answer:

- How does this artwork make you feel?
- Describe the colors in the artwork.
- Describe the lines in this artwork.

Examples of questions that require factual responses, yet also elicit a personal answer through discussion:

- Is there any symbolic meaning?
- What can we tell about the people in the piece of art?
- What important details are included?
- Does the artwork show movement?


