These notebooking pages are designed to encourage students to research world landmarks and learn about when they were built, where they are located, and many other facts about them. Following the seven landmarks featured in this pack is a notebooking page that will allow your student to research one of the landmarks more deeply and write about their findings.


You will also find a short Sort it Out quiz at the end of the notebooking unit covering additional details of the landmarks. These can be used to encourage further study and research. An answer key to the quiz follows.

There are many ways to use this pack in your studies:

- These notebooking pages are perfect for deeper research after students have studied a time period or area of the world in history or social studies.
- Parents and teachers can use the pack to help create a list of ideas or areas you wish to explore as you plan your studies.
- Students can use the notebooking pages as a starting point for independent study. Have students take the research questions to the library or use at the computer to search for the answers to the questions. Allow plenty of time for rabbit trails so students can investigate facts and stories they discover as they complete their research for each landmark.
- It can also be used as a tool to help students practice and sharpen research and notetaking skills. Have students record where they find the answers to each question as they would if they were doing research for a paper or presentation. You can also use this record of sources to help them dig deeper into the topics that interest them.

However you use the pack in your curriculum, I hope you find many beautiful, historic landmarks to discuss together!

Sort It Out

Below are listed facts about certain landmarks. Write the number of each fact below the name of the landmark it goes with.

1. This landmark was surrounded by a mound of rocks, which helped to support the larger rocks that stood upright.
2. This landmark was struck on June 6, 1944, and the sound was broadcast nationwide to announce that the Allies had landed in France.
3. This landmark was used a great deal in Nazi propaganda and was the site of a parade when Adolf Hitler came to power in 1933.
4. One section of this very long landmark is located on Mount Badaling and is about 35 feet high.
5. This landmark has a main door that dates back to the 16th century.
6. This landmark has a rotating restaurant 500 feet above the ground.
7. This landmark has a 199-step climb to the gallery where you can see the state of Delaware in the right weather conditions.
8. The current landmark at the site has been there for more than 150 years. It is actually the third one built, as the first was lost due to erosion and the second crumbled because it was not well built.
9. This landmark has watchtowers every 100-200 yards, which are about 40 feet high, and were once used as lookout posts.
10. This landmark is the oldest large rough stone monument found in Ireland to this date.
11. This landmark, which is about 66 feet high, 213 feet wide, and 36 feet deep, came to symbolize a divided Germany as access to it was shut off by the Berlin Wall.
12. This landmark was hidden in a church in Allentown, Pennsylvania, when the enemy entered Philadelphia in 1777.
13. This landmark has Flanders tapestries hanging on the walls that illustrate what daily life was like there in the 16th century.
14. The restaurant in this landmark is still in use, and banquet facilities have been added. There is an aircraft beacon and three elevators, one for freight and two for visitors.
