# Answer Key

The *Deepwater Horizon* oil rig sat over a well drilled in a <u>valley</u> called the Mississippi Canyon in the <u>continental</u> shelf. The oil company BP was leasing the rig from an oil drilling company, <u>Transocean</u>. A contractor had installed a concrete core that was supposed to <u>seal</u> the well for future use. On April 20, 2010, natural gas surged and blasted through the <u>concrete</u> core, <u>fracturing</u> it. The natural gas traveled up to the rig's platform and ignited. The initial <u>explosion</u> killed eleven workers and injured seventeen others.

The rig <u>sank</u> on the morning of April 22, 2010. When this happened, it damaged the <u>riser</u> (a vertical pipe). The drilling mud that had been <u>injected</u> through the riser was supposed to push down on the oil and natural gas in the well to keep it from <u>escaping</u>. With the riser damaged, it could no longer keep the oil <u>contained</u>, and oil began leaking into the water. Originally, the oil was thought to be coming out of the well at a <u>volume</u> of about 1,000 barrels a day. By the time the leak reached its <u>worst</u>, it was <u>estimated</u> to be leaking 60,000 barrels a day.

The rig had a fail-safe <u>device</u> that should have stopped the oil from leaking, but the device <u>failed</u>. Additional efforts to stop the leak, such as placing a <u>containment</u> dome over the largest leak and pumping more drilling mud into the well, also failed. Finally, in early June, <u>engineers</u> were able to place a loose <u>cap</u> over the well. Some oil still escaped, but the cap allowed BP to <u>siphon</u> off some of the oil to a tanker.

In early July, the cap was removed so something more <u>permanent</u> could be <u>installed</u>. This was completed by July 12, 2010. More steps were taken in August and September to allow cement to be <u>pumped</u> into the well in such a way as to <u>completely</u> seal it. It was finally sealed on September 17, 2010.

The oil that <u>escaped</u> from the well before it was sealed caused an oil <u>slick</u> that covered more than 57,500 square miles (149,000 square km) of the Gulf of Mexico. In the open water, <u>dispersants</u> were applied that broke up the oil to make it easier for <u>bacteria</u> to consume it. Parts of the oil slick were able to be contained, siphoned off, and <u>burned</u>.

As early as May, the oil had begun <u>contaminating</u> beaches in Louisiana. This oil was removed, but the oil that contaminated the marshes and <u>estuaries</u> in Louisiana could not be removed as <u>easily</u>. By June, many beaches in <u>Mississippi</u>, Alabama, and Florida had also been contaminated.

Nothing can measure the loss of human life or the <u>suffering</u> of those who were injured. There were also <u>tremendous</u> contamination expenses and <u>extraordinary</u> effects on the economy. Many <u>federal</u> waters in the Gulf of Mexico were closed to fishing for a time, a <u>moratorium</u> on offshore drilling left between 8,000 and 12,000 workers <u>unemployed</u> for a period, and many in the tourism <u>industry</u> lost work. President Obama demanded that BP create a <u>compensation</u> fund for people impacted by the oil spill. However, by 2013, the fund was almost <u>spent</u>, partly due to a lack of <u>oversight</u> which allowed <u>government</u> organizations to be paid for extremely <u>inflated</u> claims that were submitted.

President Obama formed the National Commission on the BP Deepwater Horizon Oil Spill

and Offshore Drilling in May 2010 to investigate the <u>accident</u>. They found the fault to be both the <u>Obama</u> administration's lack of <u>regulatory</u> oversight and BP and their partners' <u>negligence</u> and shortcuts. The Commission also faulted the Obama <u>administration's</u> response to the spill. Many court cases, both <u>criminal</u> and civil, were brought as a <u>result</u> of the spill and lasted into 2016.

#### 2012

In Libya in the spring of 2011, an uprising <u>escalated</u>. The uprising had begun in February 2011 against <u>Muammar</u> al-Qaddafi, who had ruled Libya for about <u>forty</u> years. It started with anti-government rallies because of the <u>arrest</u> of a human rights attorney. Security forces used non-lethal means to try to stop the <u>uprising</u>, but many were still hurt. As the protests got worse and spread, the government began using <u>lethal</u> force. The security forces, backed by <u>mercenaries</u>, fired into the crowds and attacked them with <u>tanks</u> and artillery on the ground and warplanes and <u>helicopters</u> from the <u>air</u>. The government restricted <u>communications</u>, blocked the Internet, and interrupted <u>telephone</u> service.

As the <u>violence</u> mounted, many countries <u>condemned</u> the actions of the <u>government</u>. Within the government, many high-ranking officials <u>resigned</u> because they disagreed with the government stance. There were even Libyan fighter <u>pilots</u> who defected rather than bomb Benghazi as they were <u>ordered</u>. The protests <u>continued</u>, and the government seemed as though it was losing <u>ground</u> in the fight.

After February 23, 2011, foreign <u>journalists</u> began getting into the country to <u>report</u> on what was happening for the first time. While many foreign countries <u>objected</u> to the government's stance, they could not do too much <u>immediately</u>. There were still people waiting to be evacuated, and they needed to be kept <u>safe</u> until they had fled.

Early in March, many <u>rebel</u> groups merged under the Transitional National Council. Their purpose was to lead the <u>military</u> for the rebels, help the people in the <u>areas</u> that were held by the rebels, and help get the country on a path to a <u>democratic</u> government. Qaddafi's government began taking the lead again in the <u>country</u>, but the rebels did not give up. Foreign countries tried to get in contact with the <u>Transitional</u> National Council and find ways to condemn the <u>Qaddafi</u> government. One suggestion was to impose a <u>no-fly</u> zone over Libya, which would stop the air attacks on the rebels. <u>France</u>, the United Kingdom, and other countries supported this approach, but the United States, <u>Germany</u>, and others did not. Finally, on March 17, 2011, the UN Security Council voted to <u>authorize</u> military action, including the no-fly zone. On March 19, 2011, <u>warplanes</u> with <u>missiles</u> from UN countries attacked in an effort to disable Libya's air force and air <u>defense</u> systems. Fighting between government forces and the rebels continued on the ground, and on March 27, 2011, NATO took command of the military intervention in Libya.

The U.S. <u>envoy</u> to Libya, John Christopher ("Chris") Stevens arrived in <u>Benghazi</u> on April 5, 2011, with the <u>task</u> of reaching out to the <u>Libyan</u> rebels. The United Kingdom, France, and Italy said they would send advisers in early April to try to work out a <u>peace</u> plan but stressed that their advisers would not take part in the <u>fighting</u>. By early September 2011,

the rebel forces were in control of <u>Tripoli</u> and began trying to set up a <u>new</u> government. On October 20, 2011, Qaddafi was found and <u>killed</u> by rebel forces.

Mr. Stevens was <u>appointed</u> the U.S. ambassador to Libya in May 2012. He was <u>based</u> in Tripoli, but on September 10, 2012, he went to the U.S. <u>compound</u> in Benghazi to work there. On the night of September 11, 2012, Islamic <u>militants</u> who were thought to be working with al-Qaeda, attacked the compound and set fire to the <u>building</u>. Mr. Stevens and technology specialist Sean Smith hid in a safe <u>room</u>. By the time help arrived, Mr. Smith had died of <u>asphyxiation</u>, and Mr. Stevens couldn't be found because of the <u>smoke</u>. Mr. Stevens was found later by local Libyans and taken to the <u>hospital</u>, but he was already dead.

A second <u>attack</u> occurred at the CIA compound nearby, and a third attack occurred there the next <u>morning</u>. Mortars were fired into the compound, and two <u>security</u> agents were killed. Local Libyans who were part of friendly <u>militias</u> took the rest of the Americans to the airport.

As <u>investigations</u> into the attacks were conducted, the Obama administration tried to place the <u>blame</u> for the attacks on an anti-Islam video produced and <u>posted</u> on YouTube by an Egyptian-American. This video had caused <u>demonstrations</u> at the U.S. embassy in Cairo. However, no protests connected to this <u>video</u> had occurred in Libya. Further investigation found the blame belonged to <u>bureaucratic</u> measures that were not sufficient to prevent the attacks or to respond to them <u>properly</u>. Secretary of State Hillary Clinton assumed responsibility for the <u>failures</u> in the bureaucracy and put into place all of the reforms recommended by the Accountability Review Board.

#### 2013

Ever since 1897, the Boston Marathon, the oldest <u>annual</u> marathon in the world, has been run on Patriots' Day. The marathon is 26 <u>miles</u> 385 yards (42,195-meters) from Hopkinton to Boston's <u>Back</u> Bay section. Historically, the state of Massachusetts <u>celebrated</u> Patriots' Day on April 19 of each year in <u>memory</u> of the Battles of Lexington and Concord, the <u>first</u> battles of the American Revolution. It was changed to the <u>third</u> Monday in April in 1969.

On April 15, 2013, more than 26,000 <u>runners</u> gathered for the 117<sup>th</sup> running of the race. The runners <u>began</u> between 9:00 a.m. and 10:40 a.m. Many runners had completed the race by <u>noon</u>, but there were still thousands of runners continuing to <u>race</u> in the afternoon and many spectators <u>cheering</u> them on.

At about 2:50 p.m., a <u>bomb</u> exploded along the course about 100 feet (30 meters) from the <u>finish</u> line. About twelve seconds later, a <u>second</u> bomb exploded about 500-600 feet (150-180 meters) from the first explosion. More than 260 people were <u>injured</u>, and <u>three</u> were killed.

Video of the <u>sites</u> of the bombings were studied, along with photographs that had been taken by the <u>public</u>. On April 18, 2013, brothers <u>Tamerlan</u> Tsarnaev, 26, and his younger

brother Dzhokhar, 19, were said to be <u>suspects</u>. Later that night, the brothers shot and <u>killed</u> a campus police officer and stole a car. The car was spotted by police and <u>chased</u>. A gunfight resulted. Upon capture, Tamerlan Tsarnaev was killed in an accident. <u>Dzhokhar</u> escaped. A shelter in place <u>order</u> was issued for the area while police searched for Dzhokhar Tsarnaev. Finally, during the <u>evening</u> of April 19, 2013, the shelter in place order was <u>lifted</u> and soon after, Dzhokhar, who had been seriously wounded, was found hiding on a <u>boat</u> at a <u>home</u> in Watertown.

Federal authorities charged Dzhokhar with <u>capital</u> crimes, and a grand jury indicted him on <u>thirty</u> criminal counts, seventeen of which were capital offenses. He pleaded not <u>guilty</u>. He was convicted in a <u>trial</u> that began in January 2015 and lasted into April. He was sentenced to 6 <u>death</u> sentences, 20 sentences of life in prison, and 4 sentences of 7-25 years. His attorneys filed <u>appeals</u>, and in July 2020, the death sentence was overturned. As of the time of publishing this <u>unit</u>, he is set to <u>appear</u> in a new trial dealing only with whether or not he should be <u>executed</u>.

#### 2016

The political parties involved in the 2015 <u>nominating</u> process for President of the United States had many <u>candidates</u> to choose from. The Republican Party had <u>seventeen</u> candidates in the early primaries and seemed to be in a good position to have a <u>chance</u> at the presidency since the Democratic president had already <u>served</u> two terms and could not run again. Although the economy had improved during President Obama's <u>administration</u>, the new jobs were often not full time and the <u>recovery</u> from the financial problems of 2008 was slow. The health program that was his <u>signature</u> program for the country was failing <u>financially</u>. The United States seemed to be losing <u>influence</u> in foreign affairs.

On the <u>Democratic</u> side, Hillary Clinton seemed to have solid backing from the Democratic Party but was surprisingly <u>challenged</u> by Vermont Senator Bernie Sanders, a Democratic <u>Socialist</u>. The Democratic Party rules set aside <u>fifteen</u> percent of the delegates to the Democratic Convention as "superdelegates" who are not chosen by the <u>people</u> at primaries or <u>caucuses</u>. These people were <u>prominent</u> Democrats who backed Hillary Clinton. Senator Sanders had many <u>grassroots</u> victories, which caused Hillary Clinton to adopt new <u>positions</u> on several policies. Senator Sanders <u>dropped</u> out in early July. However, later in July, almost 20,000 emails were <u>hacked</u> and released showing Democratic officials <u>ridiculing</u> Senator Sanders and saying they were leaning toward backing Hillary Clinton. The <u>scandal</u> that followed caused the resignation of four major people from the Democratic <u>National</u> Committee.

The Democratic National Convention was very <u>united</u>, with speeches delivered by many prominent Democrats, including <u>Bill</u> Clinton and President and Mrs. Obama. Hillary Clinton chose <u>Virginia</u> Senator Tim Kaine as her vice-presidential <u>running</u> mate.

Donald <u>Trump</u> ran on the Republican Party ticket even though he had never held a <u>political</u> office. His <u>unorthodox</u> way of doing things was often ridiculed, but he <u>appealed</u> to

middle-income voters. Nine of the other primary <u>contenders</u> in the beginning of the primaries were Dr. Benjamin <u>Carson</u>, Texas Senator Ted <u>Cruz</u>, Florida Senator Marco <u>Rubio</u>, former Florida <u>Governor</u> Jeb Bush, Kentucky Senator Rand <u>Paul</u>, <u>Wisconsin</u> Governor Scott Walker, New Jersey Governor Chris <u>Christie</u>, former Arkansas Governor Mike <u>Huckabee</u>, and Ohio Governor John <u>Kasich</u>. Although Republican Jeb <u>Bush</u> had a great deal of backing at the beginning of the primary process, he dropped out <u>early</u>. Senator Ted Cruz won the <u>Iowa</u> caucus, the first match-up. However, as Donald Trump won several primary <u>victories</u>, including many in the south, Senator Cruz dropped out in early May. There were many <u>Republicans</u> who did not like Mr. Trump's ways, and this led to a <u>group</u> of Republicans who considered themselves "<u>Never</u> Trumpers."

The Republican National <u>Convention</u> showed signs of not being united. John Kasich refused to <u>attend</u> the convention. Senator Cruz would not plainly say he was <u>endorsing</u> Mr. Trump. Mr. Trump chose Indiana Governor Mike <u>Pence</u> as his vice-presidential running mate.

The campaign was <u>volatile</u> with many accusations and mistakes. While Hillary Clinton won three <u>debates</u> according to polls, the crowds at her rallies were smaller and less <u>enthusiastic</u> than those at Mr. Trump's. When the election <u>results</u> came in on November 8, 2016, Mr. Trump was declared the new <u>President</u> of the United States.

#### 2018

In January 1994, the North American <u>Free</u> Trade Agreement, often referred to as NAFTA, went into effect. Under this agreement, <u>tariffs</u> on many goods produced and <u>sold</u> in North America were gradually eliminated. There was a great deal of <u>opposition</u> to this agreement in the United States because of fears it would cause a loss of <u>jobs</u> in America due to an increase in <u>imports</u> from Mexico and a movement of production <u>plants</u> to Mexico. Side agreements were signed to try to <u>alleviate</u> these fears.

In 2017, U.S. President Donald <u>Trump</u> announced that he would renegotiate <u>NAFTA</u> in order to help jobs in the United States and deal with other matters. The negotiations <u>began</u> in August 2017. There was not much <u>progress</u> on the agreement in the beginning, with President Trump announcing in <u>April</u> 2018 that there would be import tariffs on <u>steel</u> and aluminum from Canada. The Prime Minister of <u>Canada</u> condemned this action, and there was the threat of a trade war.

In <u>August</u> 2018, an announcement was made that the United States and Mexico had reached an agreement on a new <u>trade</u> agreement that was much like NAFTA, but with some significant <u>changes</u>. Finally, on September 30, 2018, Canada agreed to <u>join</u> the new trade agreement. The updated version of NAFTA was <u>signed</u> between the United States, <u>Mexico</u>, and Canada, and called USMCA.

While the tariffs were mainly kept in place, there were new <u>rules</u> that involved automobile manufacturing, <u>digital</u> trade, intellectual property <u>protections</u>, and the environment. There were also stronger rules to protect <u>workers</u> and other provisions.
