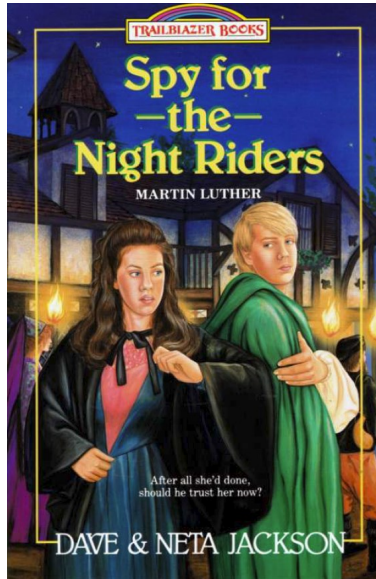

1565	Pedro Menéndez de Avilés establishes the city of St. Augustine, Florida

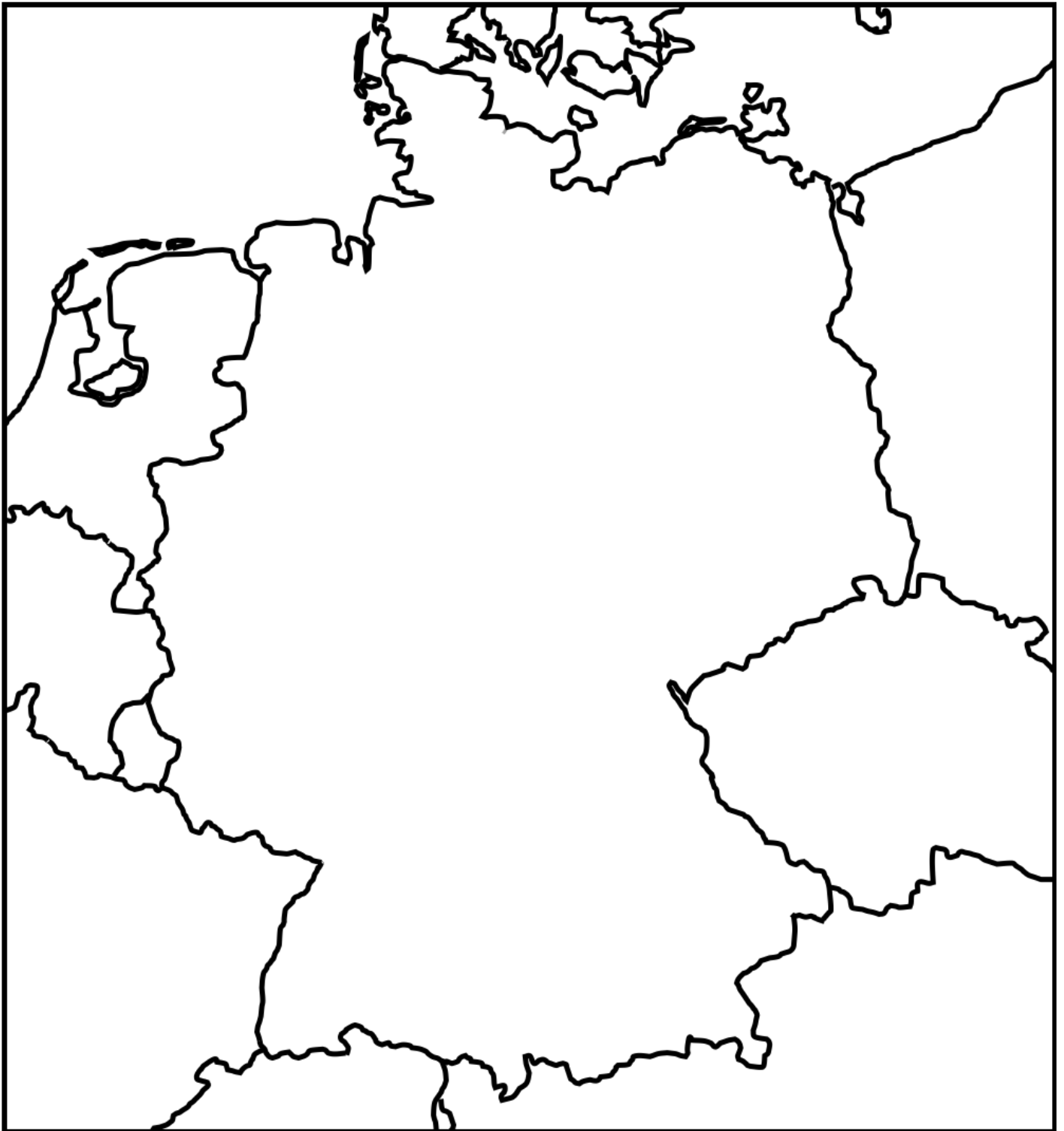
