### Scavenger Hunt

Search for items in nature that inspire you to write haiku poems. Take photos and write haikus about what you find.

#### Collage

Create a collage using images from magazines or printed from the internet that represent themes in haiku poetry. Write a haiku to accompany your collage.

#### Nature Walk

Take a walk outdoors and observe the natural world around you. Write haikus inspired by what you see, hear, and feel during your walk.

#### Music Time

Listen to different types of music and select songs that evoke emotions similar to those found in haiku poetry. Write haikus inspired by the music you listen to.

#### Draw It
