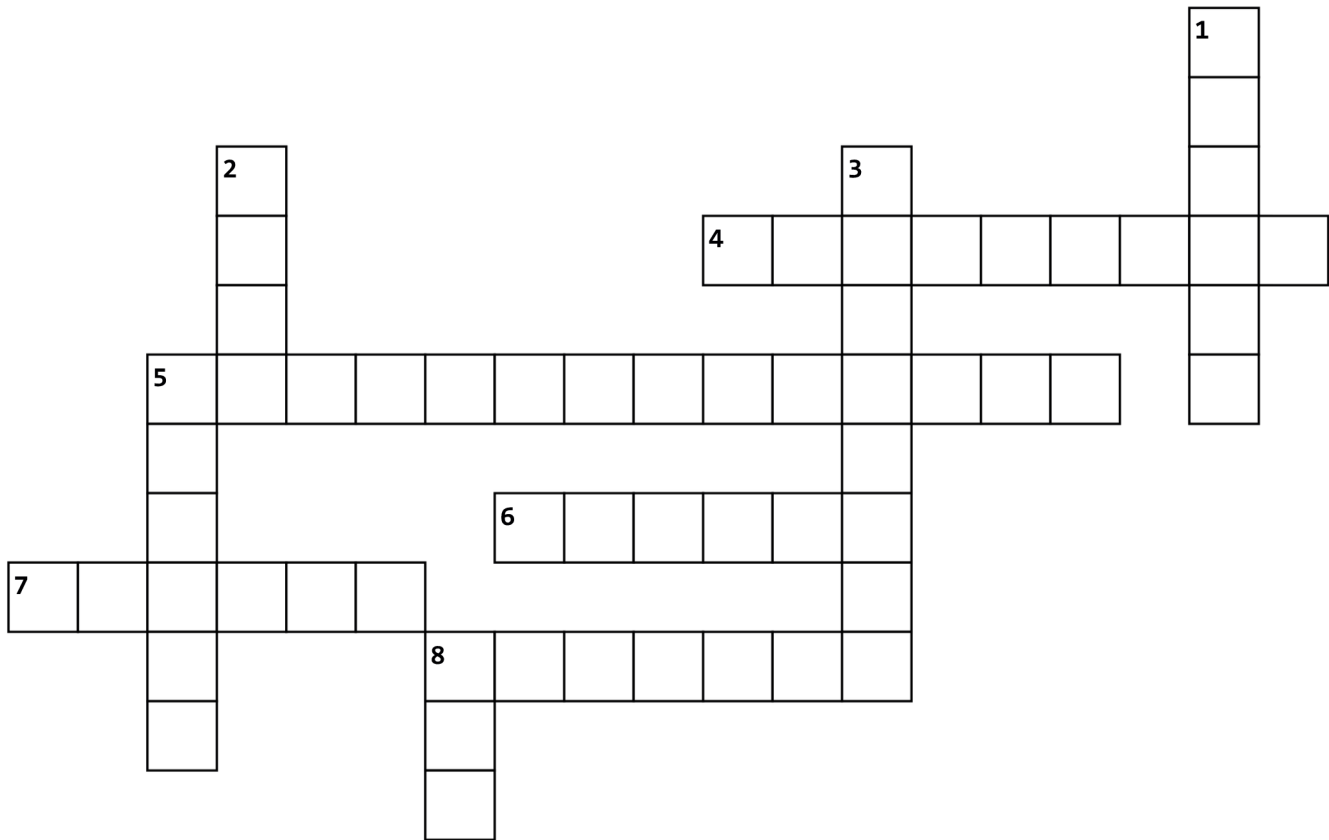

A Ship Vocabulary Crossword Puzzle

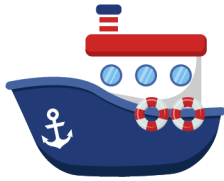

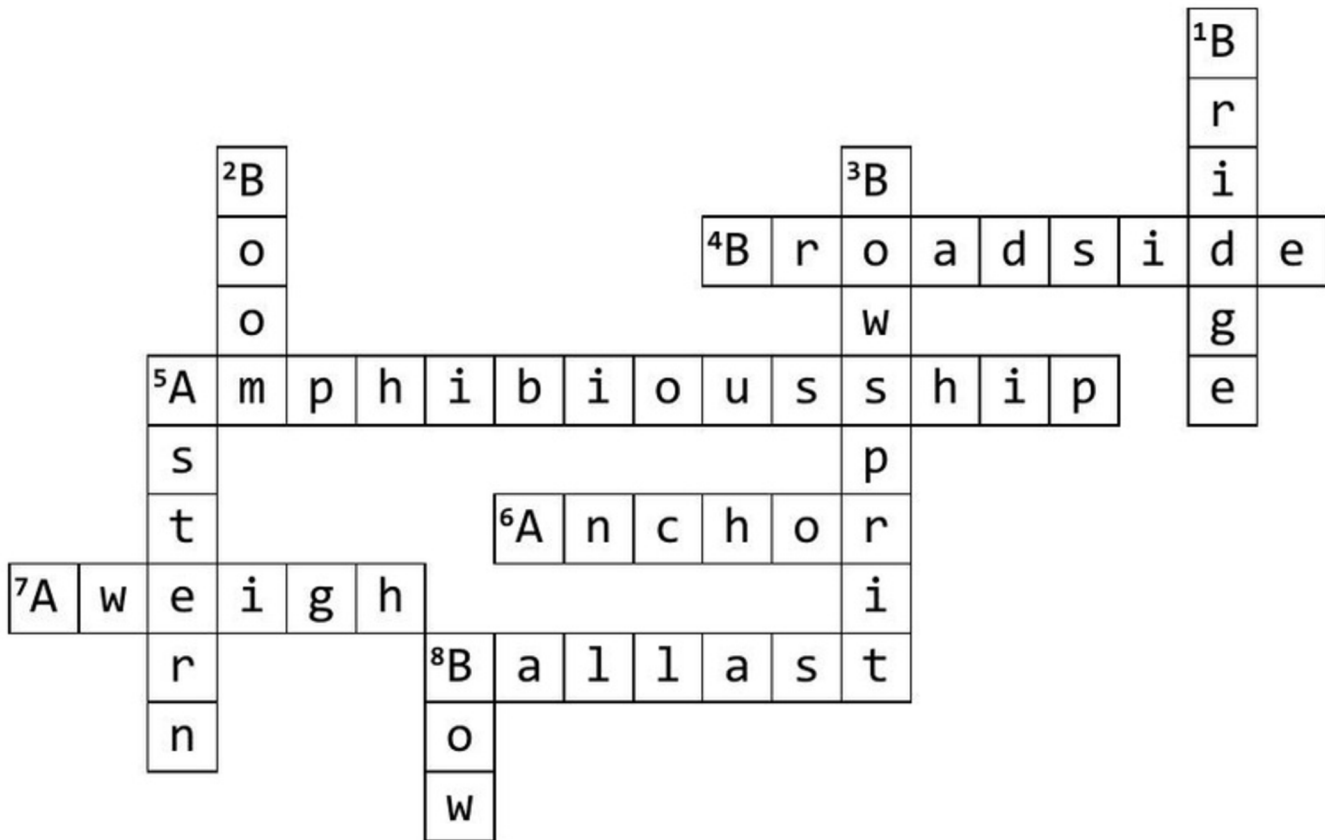
